The Raleigh Ringers on Public Television Across the United States!

As a part of the *One Winter Evening at Meymandi* video project, The Raleigh Ringers created a one-hour holiday concert special, which was broadcast several times last December throughout North Carolina on UNC-TV, North Carolina's public television station.

In July, our program was included in the APT (American Public Television) Exchange Summer Marketplace, where representatives from public television stations throughout the country view highlights from new programs offered by APT. They then vote on whether they

intend to schedule a particular offering. If at least 25 stations select a show, it is offered nationally. Although we only needed 25 "YES" votes, we received a total of 84! That number has since increased to 116 and counting.

But we can still use your help. There are APT-affiliated stations that may be undecided about programming our special this year or in future years. Your local public television station is more likely to program our concert or schedule it in a prime-time slot if you contact them

Pinnacle 2004

Roundtables, classes and networking sessions specializing in the needs of performing groups will be the focus of this event. Five Showcase concerts will be presented Friday and Saturday by some of the country's finest ensembles. The Raleigh Ringers' concert will be Saturday, January 17th at 8:00 pm. We are thrilled and honored to be in the company of so

many outstanding ringers and directors and to have the opportunity to perform for what will be an awesome audience!

We will finish up our Dallas "mini-tour" at Highland Park Presbyterian Church by presenting a concert there on Sunday afternoon, January 18th. Then it's back to the salt mines for 2004 auditions!



New Commissions

Each January, one of the first orders of business is to decide on commissions of new music for the year. This is an important aspect of The Raleigh Ringers mission which began in 1992 with *Illumination* by Bill Payn.

The Raleigh Ringers have continued their tradition of commissioning new works for bells by prominent handbell composers with five new works for 2003! This year, many are arrangements of pieces that audiences will find familiar and fun.

Hart Morris has provided a transcription of the Trans Siberian Orchestra piece *O Come All Ye Faithful/O Holy Night*, along with an arrangement of *Dueling Banjos*, which we premiered at our Spring Concert. We have also received an arrangement of *O Come, O Come Emmanuel* by Carl Wiltse, an original *Second Carillon* by Dean Wagner, and to top it all off, Andrew Metz, brother of our very own David Metz, has arranged our newest rock piece! Of course, that title will remain a secret until it is revealed during the Christmas season.

Very often, our commissioned works find their way into The Raleigh Ringer Series of published music for advanced groups. Hopefully, these pieces will be played and enjoyed by other handbell choirs and audiences soon!

They weren’t familiar with English handbells, so there was a reception after the concert, so they could look at our music and different bell sets, and try their hand at the technique needed to ring bells and chimes.

Music truly is a universal language, and it was a privilege to experience it firsthand.

Capital Campaign Update

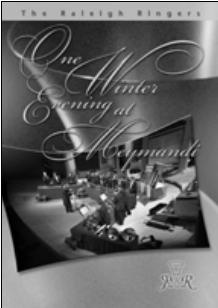
