SummerChimes 2004: An Experiment

The generosity of The Raleigh Ringers provided a three octave set of choir chimes, a bunch of music folders, and three sections of two-inch foam to Sherry Graham and Cindy Massey so they could begin a new outreach project. The intent was to bring the benefits of musicianship to a group of young people who might not otherwise have such an opportunity. Now, all they needed was the group of young people.

Through the Wake County Communities in Schools program, not one, but two groups were provided. All Sherry and Cindy had to do was travel to the Mayview and Heritage Park communities two mornings a week from June 9 through late July, and teach the new musicians a thing or two about chimes... And a thing or two about reading music, counting, listening to each other, cooperating, stage presence, and the great pleasure of performing.

Most of the kids had never played any kind of musical instrument, and only one or two could read music. But, after only six classes, they were able to perform at a commemoration of the closing of the Chavis Heights Community Center. One group performed a change ringing processional/demonstration, after which the other group played a song. They performed very well for an appreciative audience.

At the end of the SummerChimes program, having added another, more difficult piece to their repertoire, the fledgling musicians had other opportunities to perform: Mayview at the Tammy Lynn Center, and Heritage Park at their own center's end-of-summer program. With the success of the 2004 SummerChimes program, we look forward to the opportunities 2005 might hold.

The Raleigh Ringers Remember Jerry Jones and Doug Smith

This past summer The Raleigh Ringers lost two great friends and fellow handbell enthusiasts who will be sorely missed throughout the handbell world.

Jerry D. Jones, minister of music at Ridge Road Baptist Church in Raleigh, lost his battle with pancreatic cancer on July 7, 2004. Although when diagnosed he was given only three to six months to live, he rallied for 20 months, continuing to minister to those who knew him. The song "Faith" was commissioned by Ridge Road Baptist Church, The Raleigh Ringers and composed by Paul McKlveen to help raise money for Jerry's medical treatments. Through the many donations from churches and the numerous festivals that featured the song, "Faith" brought in over \$10,000 to help Jerry in his fight.

In addition to the funds raised, "Faith" also brought Jerry into contact with a number of people whose lives were also touched by cancer. Jerry wrote these words a few months before his death:

"The numbers of persons I have heard from in both current and former churches, organizations of which I have been a part, business associates, family and friends, all sharing the influence I have had on their personal Christian walk has been both humbling and amazing. The quality of my life is now overall greater than before cancer."

Less than two weeks after Jerry's death, Douglas F. Smith tragically died in an automobile accident on July 17 at the age of 52. Doug was a gifted composer and arranger of handbell music. Shortly after The Raleigh Ringers played his arrangement of "Hava Nageela" several years ago, we commissioned him to arrange two more pieces for us, Rachmaninoff's "Prelude in C# Minor" and the Stravinsky "Firebird Finale" (which is on our program for the 2004 ringing season). Earlier this year he had started working on a third piece for The Raleigh Ringers.

On September 12, though we were warned that there were roads closed due to mud slides and only bottled water to drink, we made our way to Asheville for an afternoon concert at the First Baptist Crunch as a part of their 175th Anniversary Concert Series.
