

The Friends of The Raleigh Ringers program began in 1995, and since that time, has been instrumental in helping the group fund purchases of new equipment and manage administrative expenses.

In early October, The Raleigh Ringers purchased the upper 5th octave (G#7—C8) of Petit & Fritsen Dutch handbells. This new equipment purchase brings our total "count" to 30 octaves of handbells - 366 individual instruments! We are also still on the hunt for the upper 4th octave of Petit & Fritsen handbells.

In late October, The Raleigh Ringers purchased a 15-passenger van to transport the ringers to concerts. We are very excited to have nearly eliminated the need to rent vehicles! We are very grateful to Springmoor Retirement Center for allowing us to park both vehicles in their lots, along with their generosity in giving us space to store our ever-increasing amount of equipment!

Performing on the other side of the plate-glass window that separated the small studio from hosts Tom (Bob had another gig that morning), Kristi Lee, Chick McGee, and studio guest, Tim Bedore, The Raleigh Ringers wowed their audience with Yakety Sax, Dueling Banjos, Flight of the Bumblebee, and more. We could tell from the emails and listener calls that our rendition of the Chick McGee Sports Theme was a hit, too! (Thanks to Derek Hakes of St. Luke's Methodist Church in Indianapolis, for arranging the piece for us at the last minute!)

Three hours later, the show wound down, we repacked the truck, and we hit the planned tour trail again, clutching our souvenir T-shirts and goody bags. We had been promised the gig of a lifetime, and the Bob & Tom crew certainly delivered!

Frosty recorded all of our CDs, local concerts, and demonstration recordings (Jeffers, Beckenhorst, etc). Since his retirement, Frosty had devoted his life to his recording gigs and work at WCPE 89.7, Raleigh's classical radio station. Frosty was an incredible person; always upbeat, supportive and compassionate, and his audiophile expertise was second to none. We will miss Frosty, but he will live on as the voice announcing The Raleigh Ringers at the beginning of all our concerts.
