I can remember a time not so long ago when I felt the same sentiment as the young title character in Charles Dickens's *Oliver Twist*. The final song completed, the echo of the last chord faded, and the closing bell had sounded, signifying the end of the weekend handbell festival. But I just wasn't done yet! I wanted more.

Sure, I rang in the bell choir at my church, and I was involved with a community group. I went to as many workshops, classes, and events as I could possibly get to, but still I was hungry for more.

That hunger seemed at times to be an obsession. A desire to learn more: techniques, styles, interpretations. New music! And all those people to meet! And then, somehow, in a strange twist of fate, an opportunity to audition for The Raleigh Ringers arose.

What to do? It's a big risk to take – move across the country on the off-chance that maybe I could find myself in a group that is held in such high esteem by so many in "belldom", and possibly have the opportunity to ring some really cool music and travel and perform in awesome venues and meet some really fun and interesting people? Or continue wanting more?

It's almost as if there really wasn't a decision to make. So, like young Oliver, anxious and unsure, and with a bit of urging from my friends, I took a deep breath and made that big step forward to –gulp– audition.

Was it scary? In a word ... yes. But not as bad as I thought it would be. The camaraderie of the others auditioning helped ease my fears, and gave insight into the group dynamics as well.

What is being part of The Raleigh Ringers really like? To me, it's an adventure, with new turns at every rehearsal, every event, and every tour. Getting to know this fine group of folks has been wonderful – so many differences, and yet we "gel" rather well. We don't all have 20+ years of ringing experience – some have less than you'd think! We come from a variety of backgrounds, from places all over, and have many different skills outside of the ringing world – learning these peculiarities about one another just makes the adventure even more enjoyable.

Are you too looking for more? There are opportunities throughout the year to pre-screen with The Raleigh Ringers – join us in rehearsal, come to a demorecording, or try things out at our Read & Ring for Advanced Ringers this November. If you are interested, contact David Harris at rringer@rr.org.

Bong Shop, Ding Dome, Bellagio, Belfry, Clapper Castle, Der Ring Haus, Highway to Bell, ouRR Place, Raleigh Ringatorium, Toll House, and many, many more.

And the winning name was ... uh..... none of them. The ringers got so comfortable referring to the building as Raleigh Ringers Central while waiting for it to be named, that the name stuck! While we did still award a prize in the naming contest, the final official name of our new building is simply Raleigh Ringers Central (RRC).

Another thing you can do with your own building is hold educational events in it. The Raleigh Ringers started in this direction with last fall's Read & Ring for Advanced Ringers, which will be held again in 2009. In the coming years we plan to offer other seminars and classes and would like YOUR input on what you would like to see taught.

Would your choir be interested in holding one of your rehearsals at our building, using The Raleigh Ringers' equipment, and being coached by David Harris and members of the Raleigh Ringers through problem spots in your music or with troublesome techniques?
